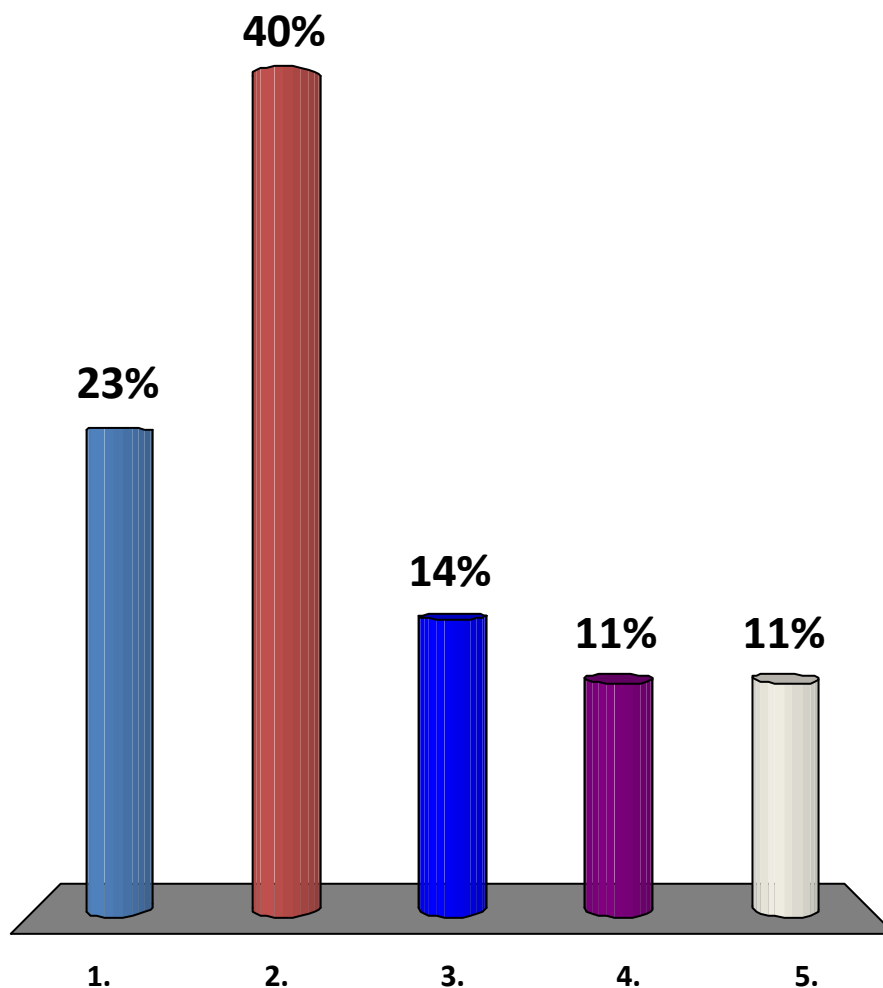

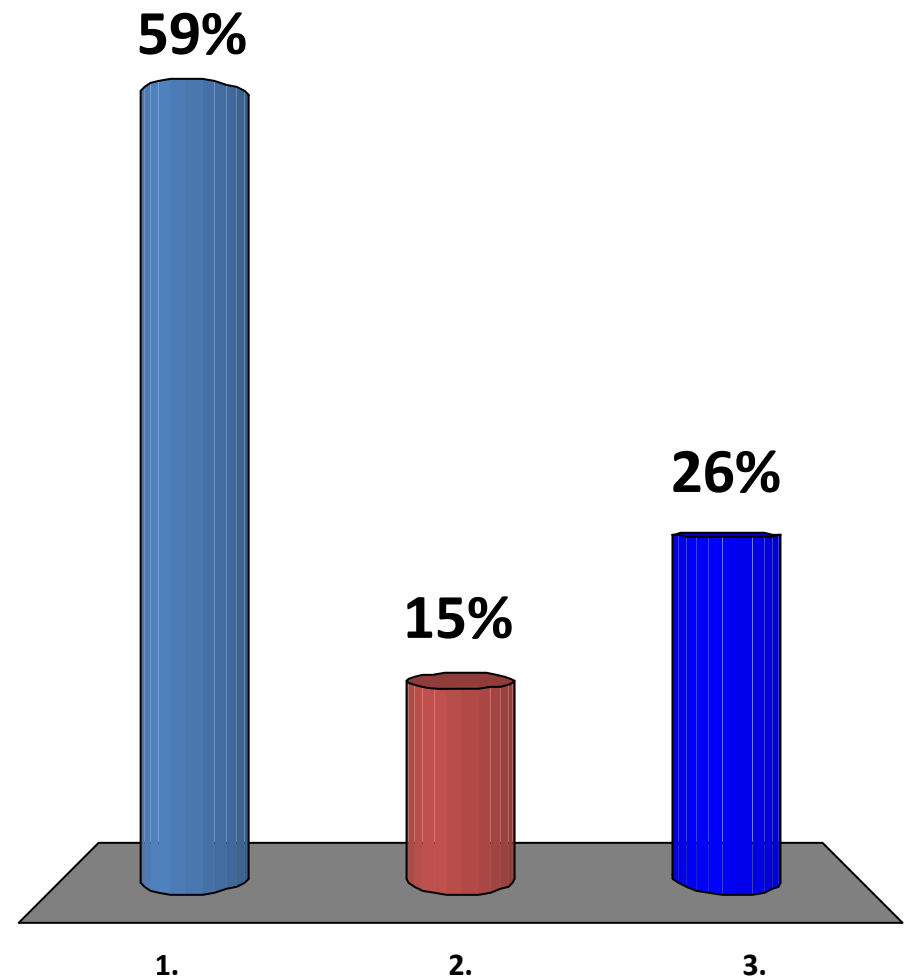

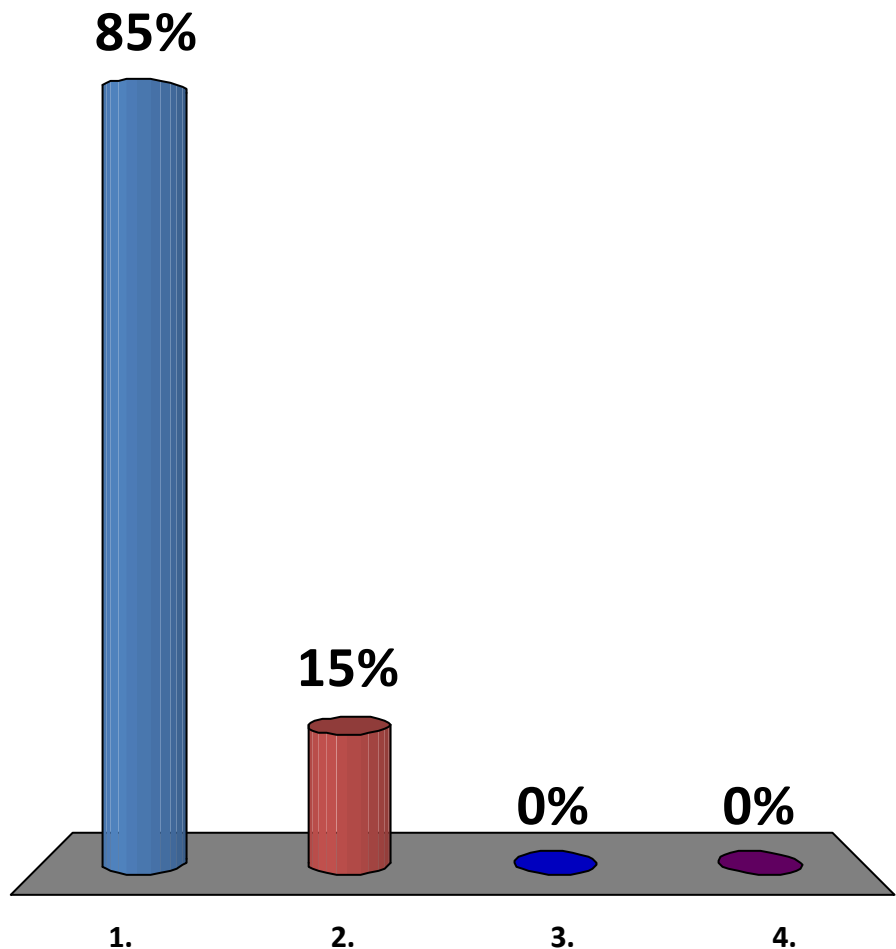

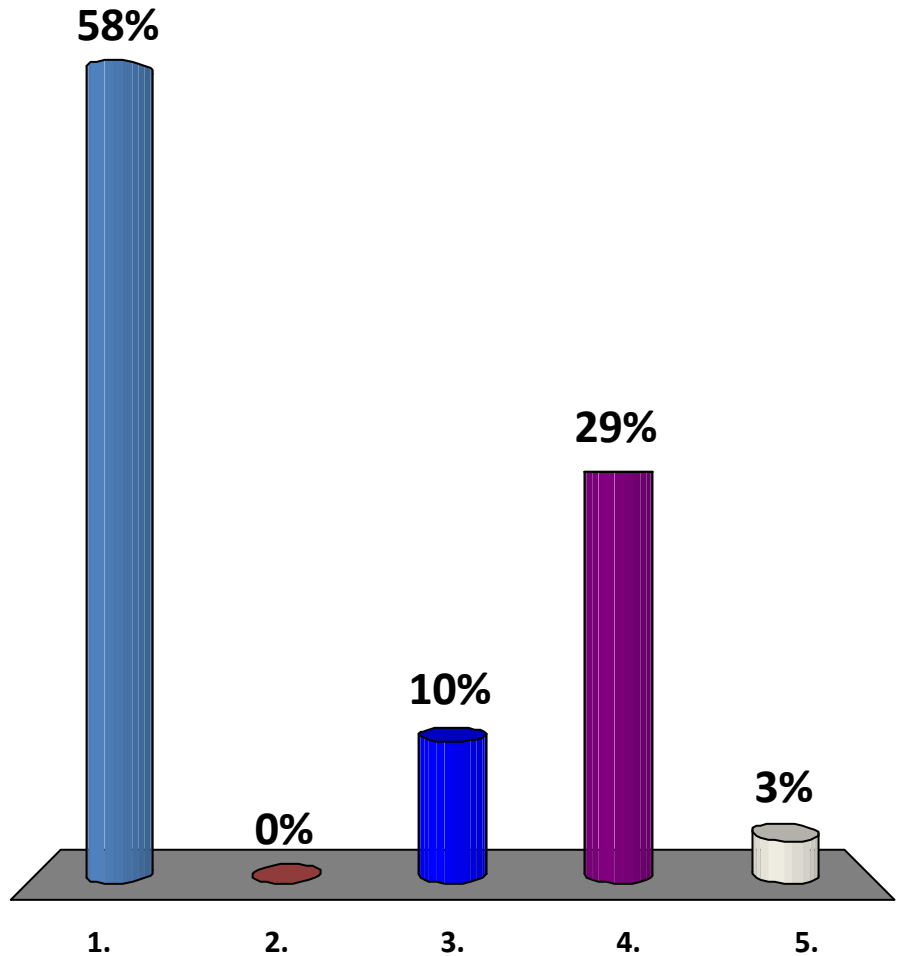

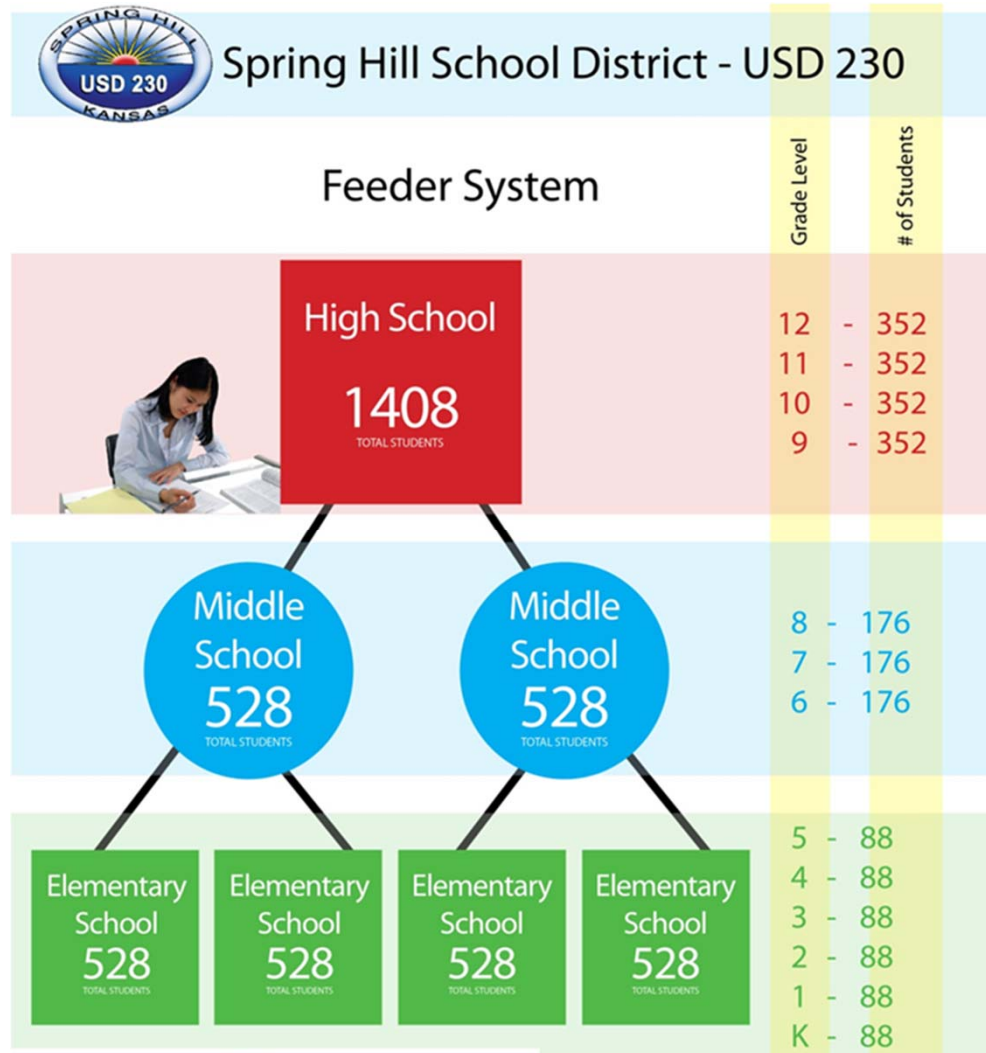

 - Address District educational technology needs
 - Address District maintenance needs

- The Board of Education authorized a \$48,600,000 bond referendum (mail-in ballot) to be run December 9, 2003.

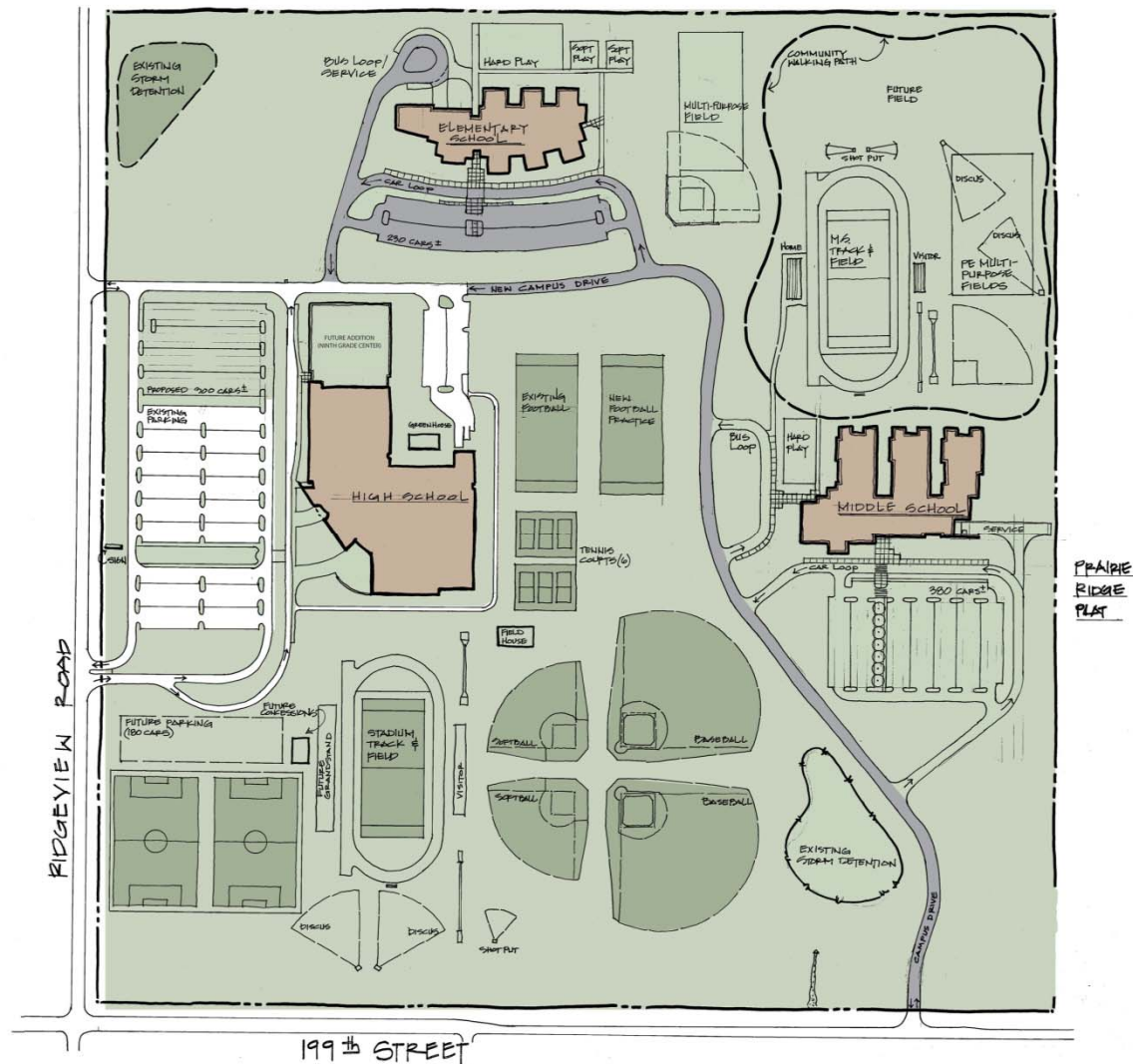

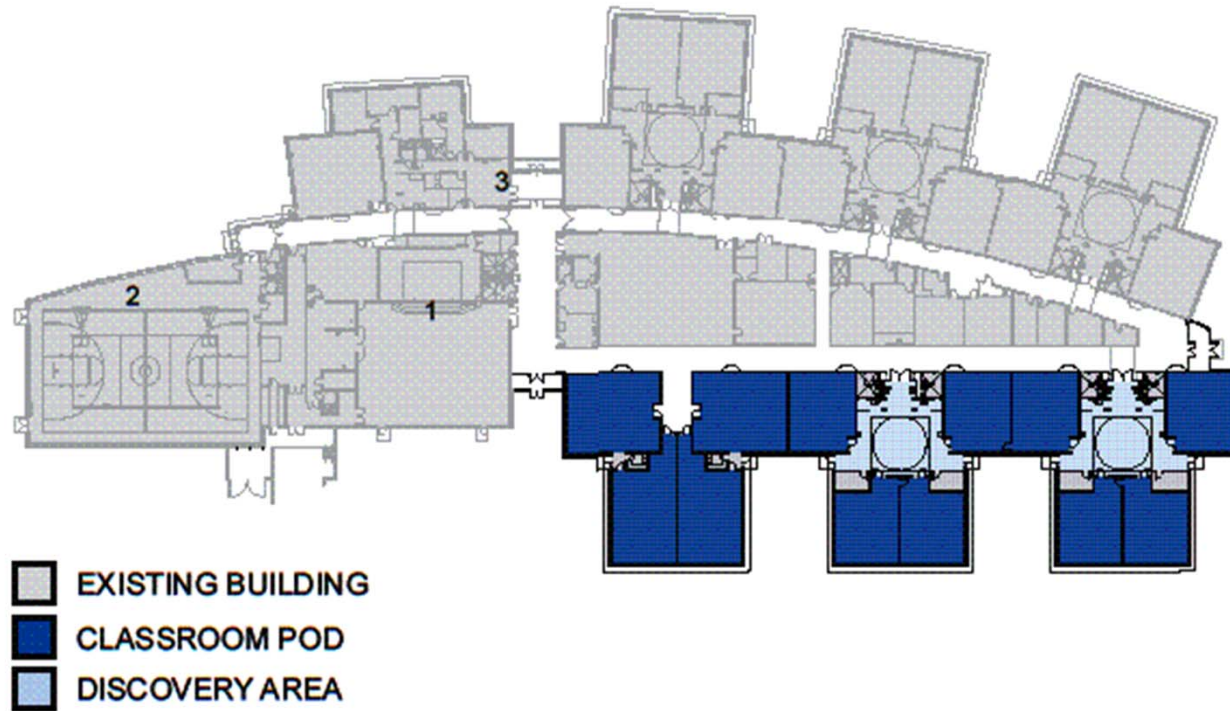
Scope of Work & Budget

– Construct Ph. 1 of new Spring Hill HS:	\$35,191,090
– Move Spring Hill MS into Spring Hill HS:	\$ 339,909
– Convert Spring Hill MS into an ES:	\$ 1,619,000
– Construct Ph. 1 of Prairie Creek ES:	\$ 8,450,000
– Address Near Term Technology Needs:	\$ 1,000,000
– USD 230 Contingency:	\$ 2,000,000
	\$48,600,000

Phase 2 Implementation Plan

2011 Bond Issue

- Community Group recommended a conservative approach in addressing District growth needs (phased construction) and near term maintenance and technology needs.
- The Board of Education authorized a \$39,000,000 bond referendum (mail-in ballot) to be run June 7, 2011.

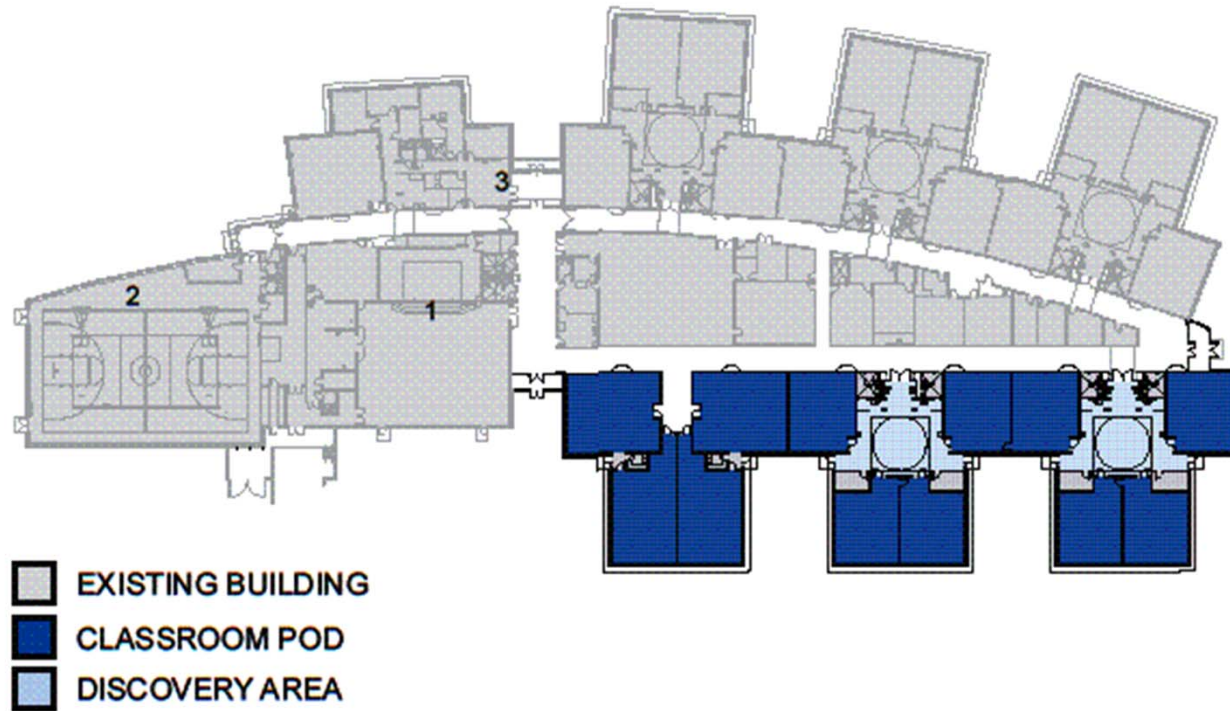

Scope of Work & Budget

– Expand Prairie Creek ES:	\$ 5,250,000
– Construct new Wolf Creek ES:	\$21,000,000
– Address All Deferred Maintenance Needs:	\$ 4,000,000
– Address Near Term Maintenance Needs:	\$ 1,500,000
– Address Near Term Technology Needs:	\$ 2,250,000
– Energy Efficient HVAC at SHES & SHMS	\$ 3,500,000
– USD 230 Contingency:	\$ 1,500,000
	\$39,000,000

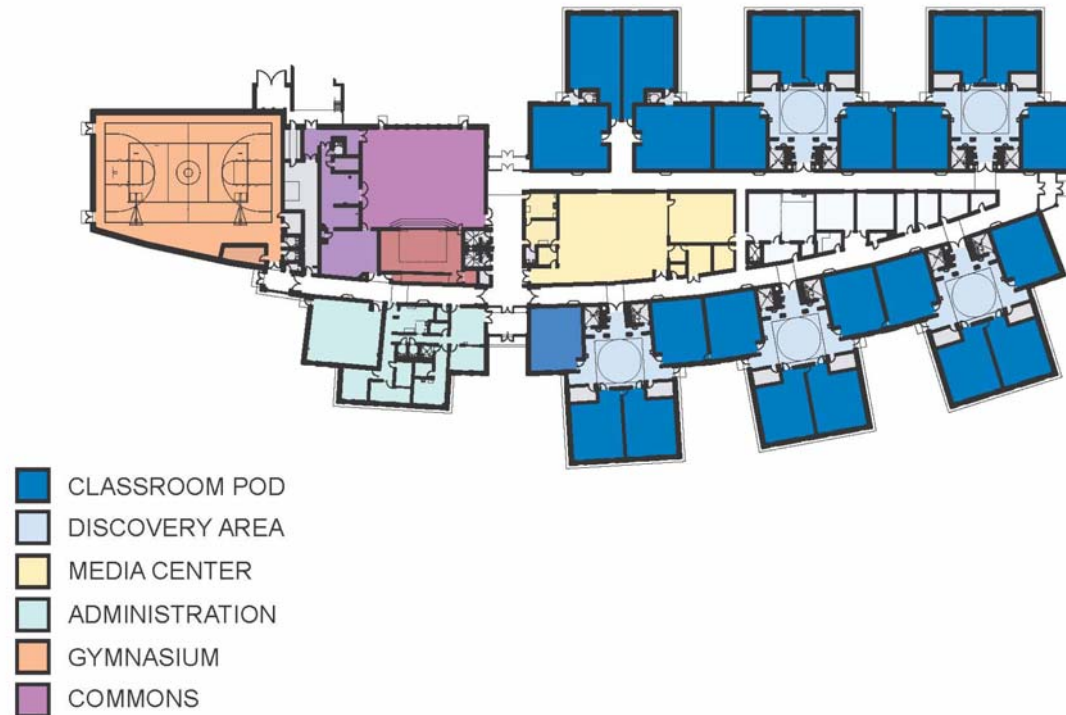
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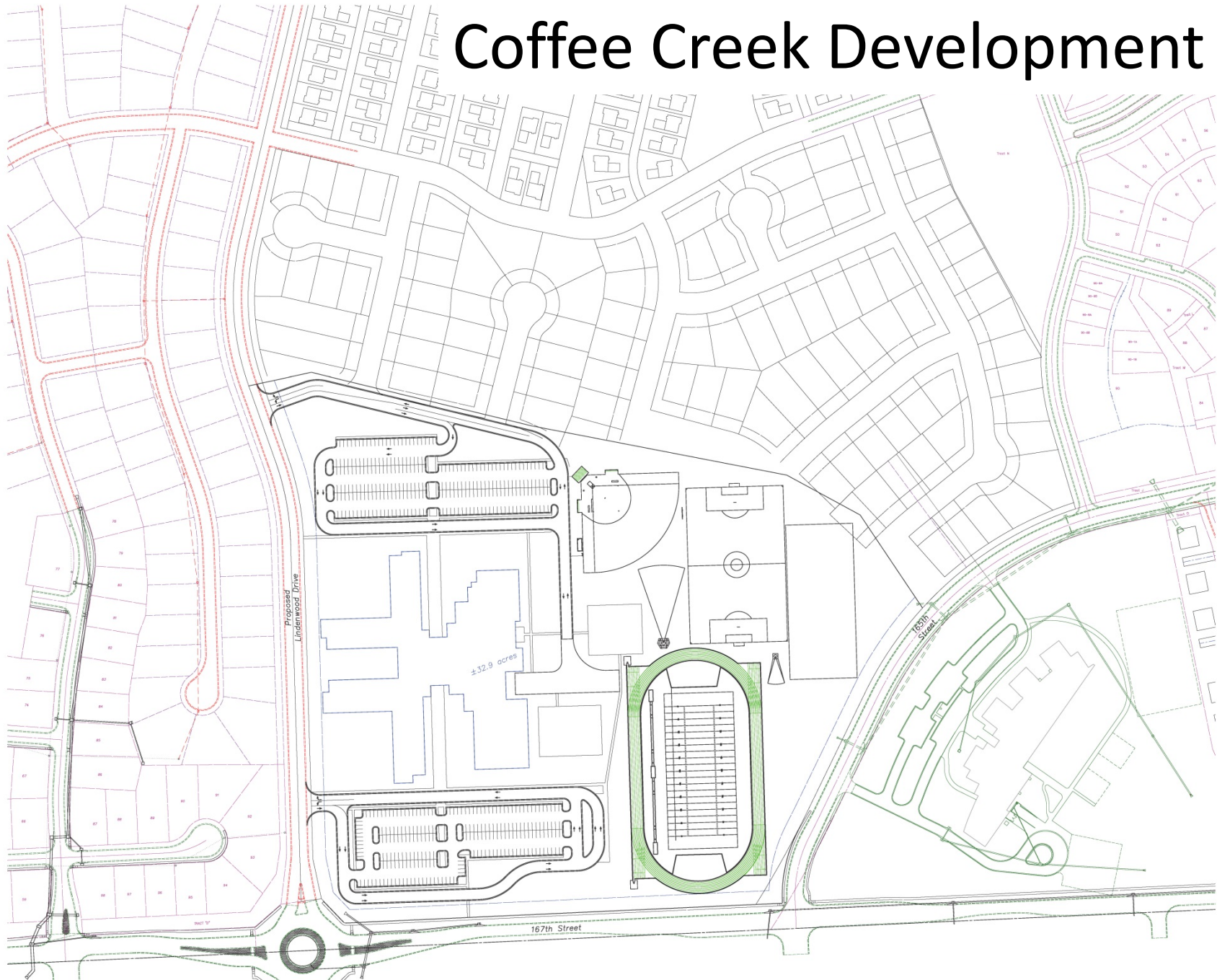
Prairie Creek ES - Exterior

Current District Needs

Current District Needs

- Per the Demographic Report, the District will exceed design capacity at its elementary schools by 2018. Prairie Creek ES will exceed its capacity by 2017. Options:
 - Construct new 528-student ES (per Master Plan)
 - Construct Ph. 1 of new 528-student ES (per Master Plan)
 - Add mobile classrooms and/or increase teacher/student ratio at existing elementary schools
- Per the Demographic Report, the District will exceed design capacity at Spring Hill HS by 2018. Options:
 - Expand SHHS to 1,408-student capacity (per Master Plan)
 - Add mobile classrooms and/or increase teacher/student ratio at existing high school

Current District Needs

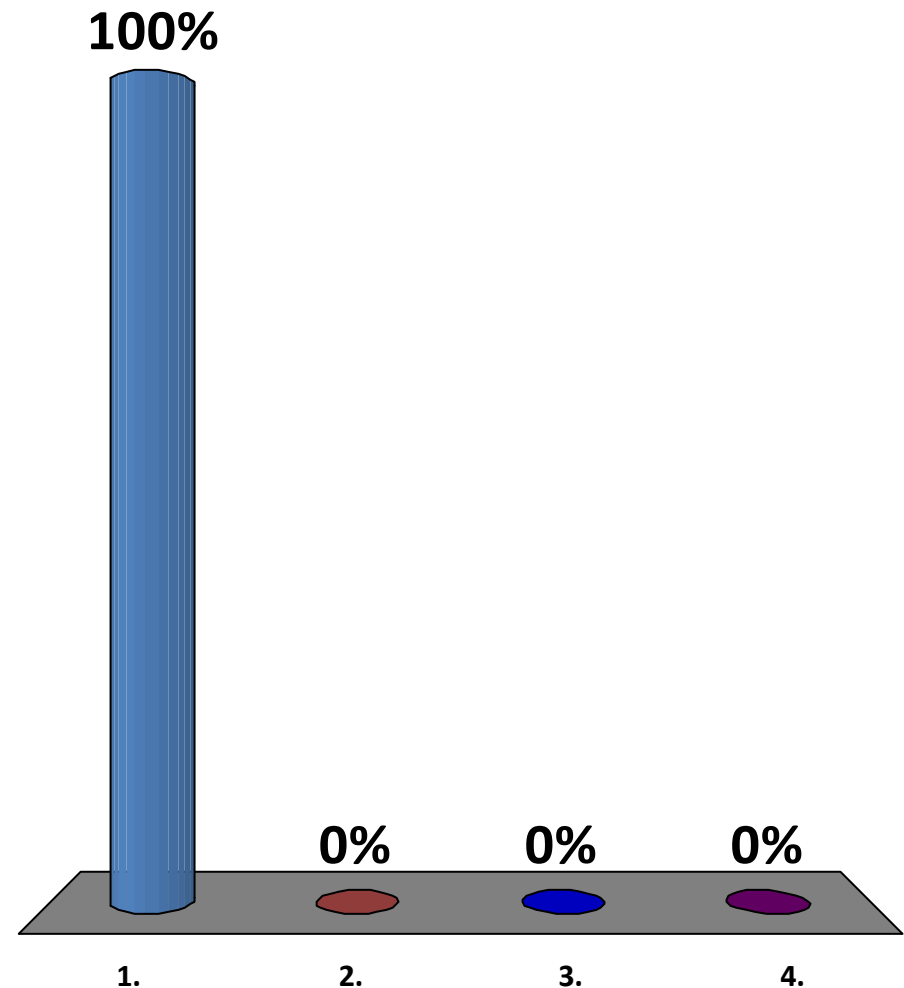
- Per the Demographic Report, the District will exceed design capacity at Spring Hill MS (North & South) by 2020. Options:
 - Construct new 528-student MS (per Master Plan)
 - Construct Ph. 1 of new 528-student MS (per Master Plan)
 - Add mobile classrooms and/or increase teacher/student ratio at existing middle school
- Complete District Athletic Complex at Spring Hill HS Campus.
- Expand District Early Childhood Program.
- Address Deferred Maintenance Needs.
 - Parking Lots & Drives (PCES Bus/Car Loops)
 - Roofs
 - Building Infrastructure (HVAC, Plumbing, Electrical)
 - Flooring

Current District Needs

- Address Deferred Technology & Equipment Needs.
 - Personal Computing Devices
 - Technology Infrastructure (wireless, cabling, switches, routers)
 - Furniture
 - Equipment (mowers, tractors)

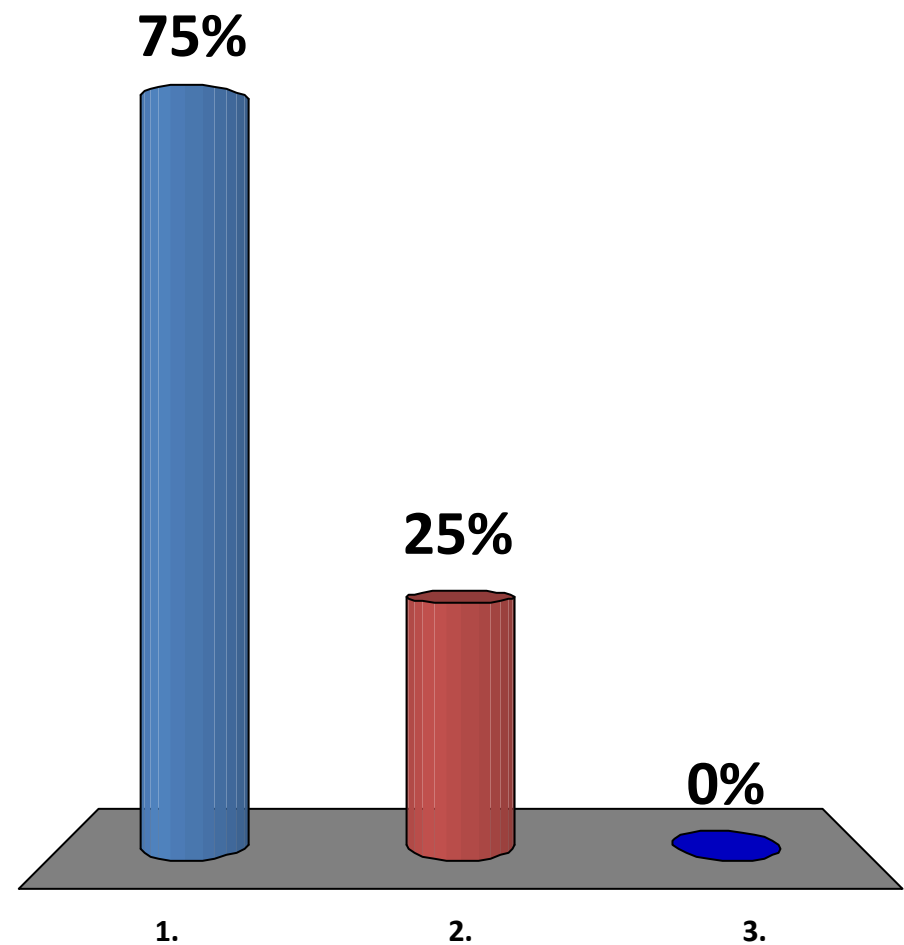
Future facility solutions to solve student enrollment growth challenges should focus on:

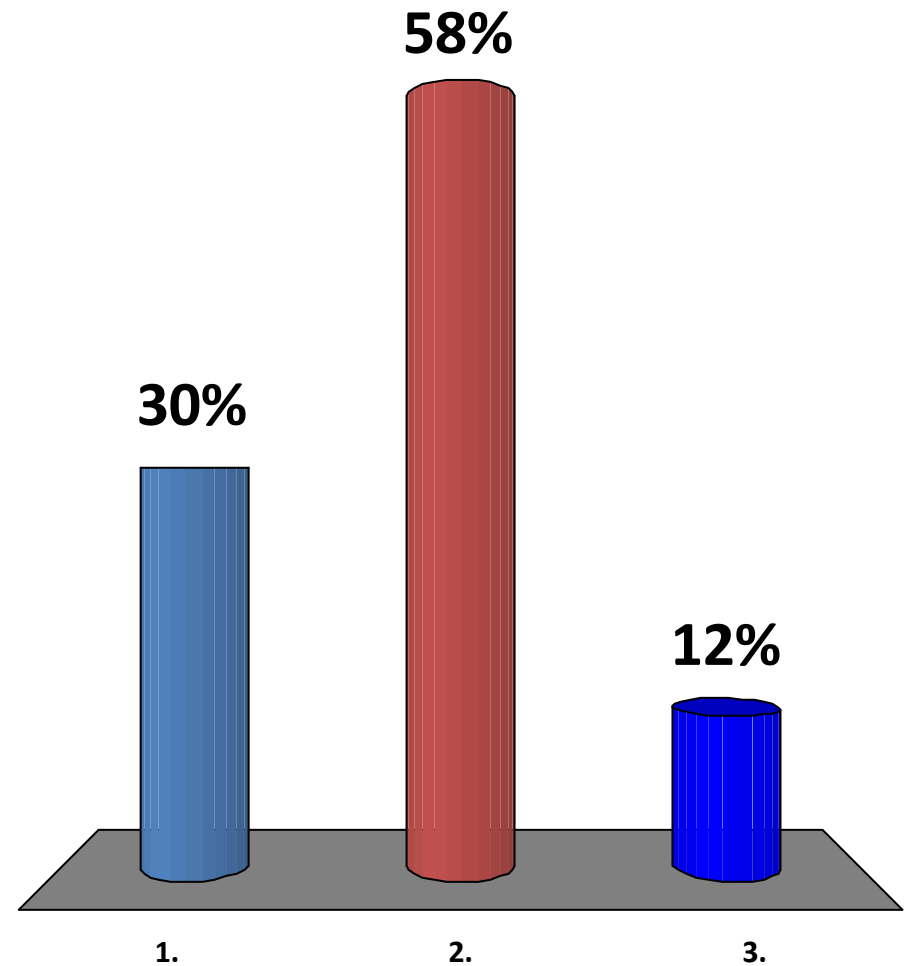
Where does providing schools to accommodate growth rank priority wise compared to other district needs:

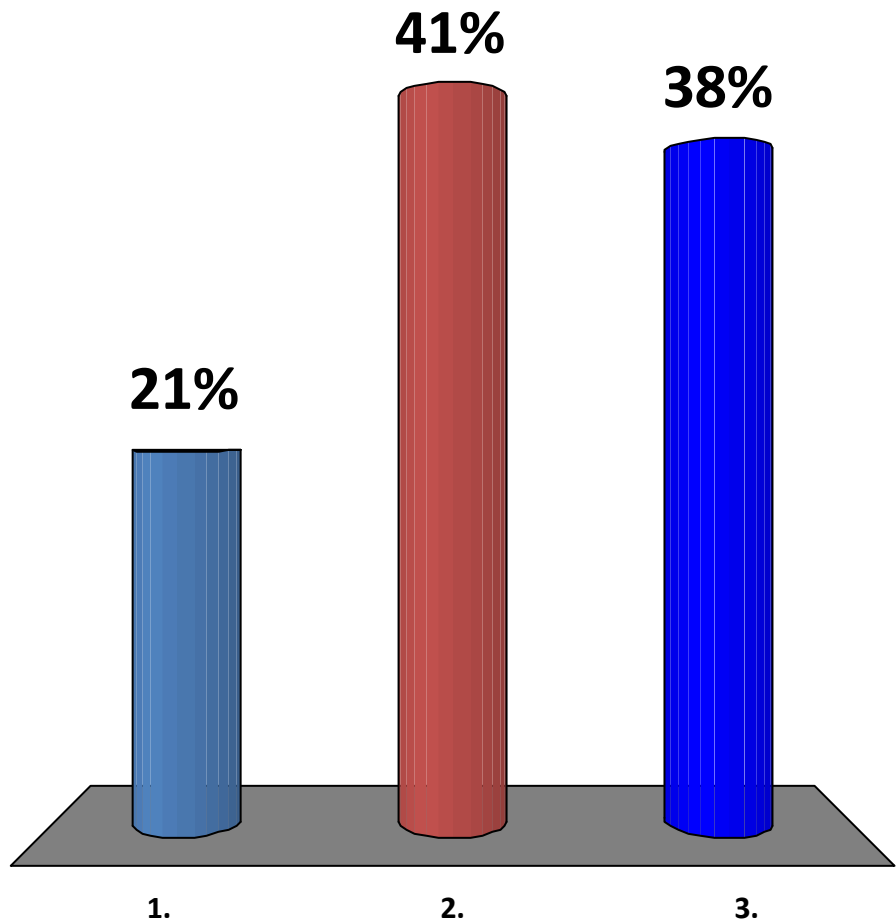
Where does early childhood rank priority wise compared to other district needs:

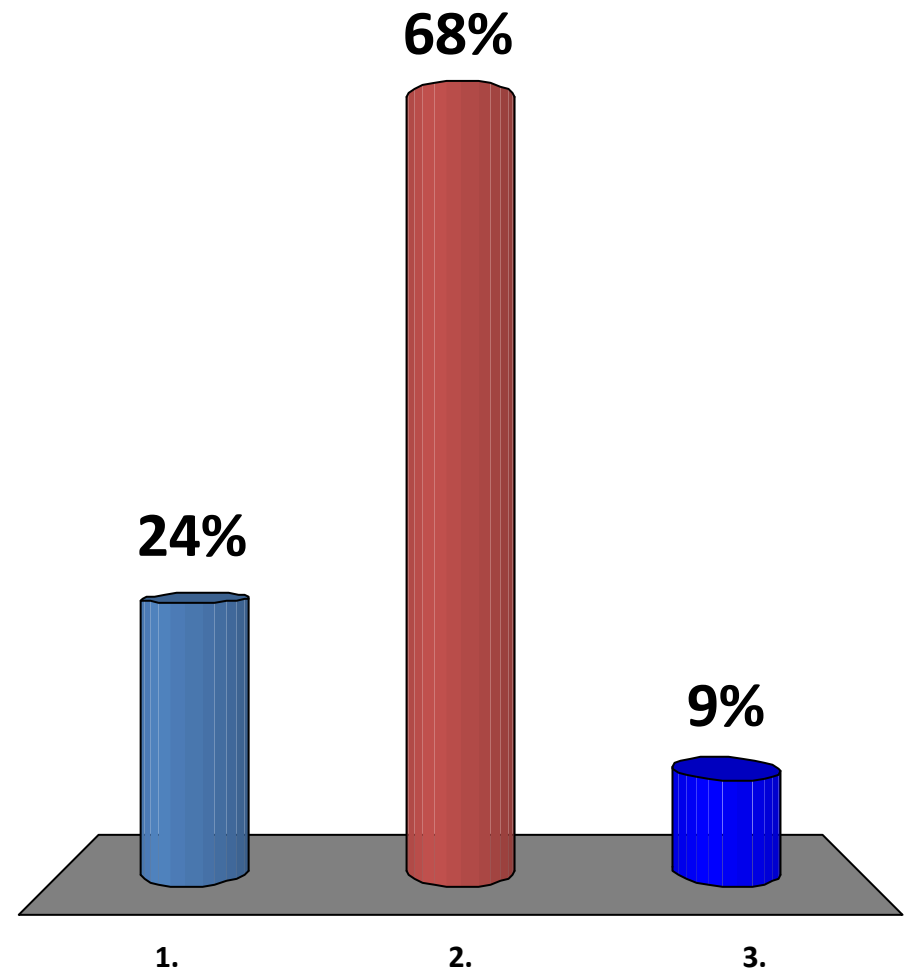
Where does completing the High School District Athletic Complex (DAC) rank priority wise compared to other district needs:

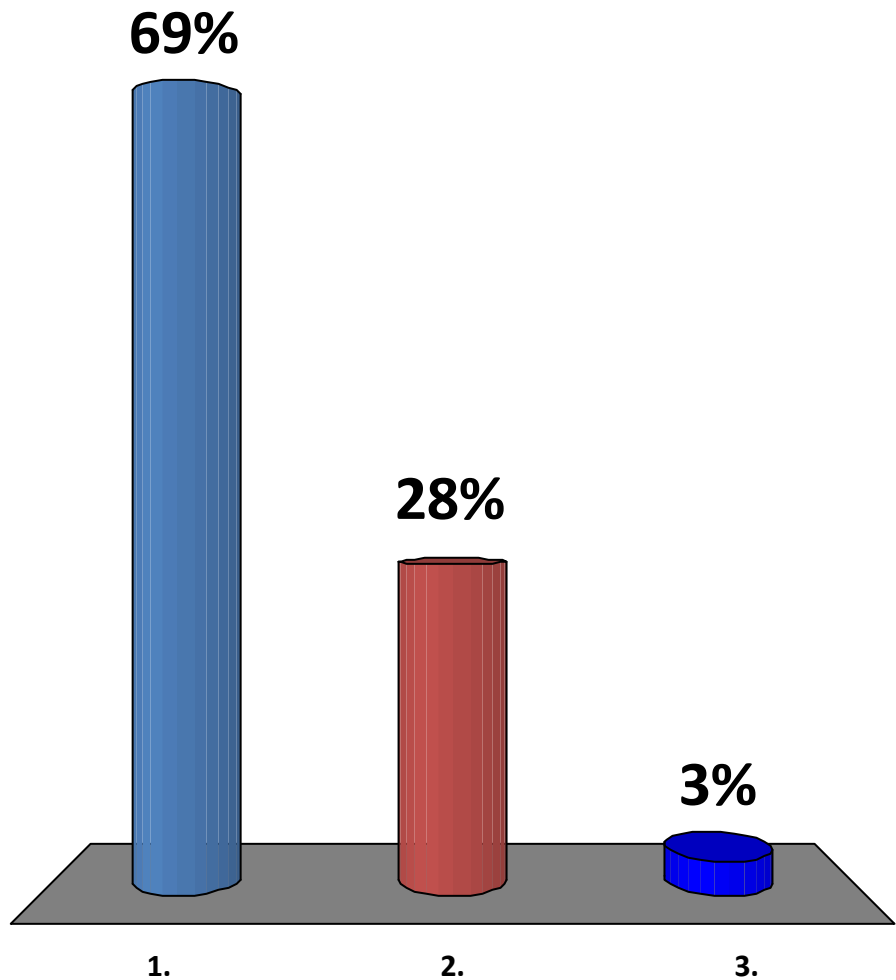

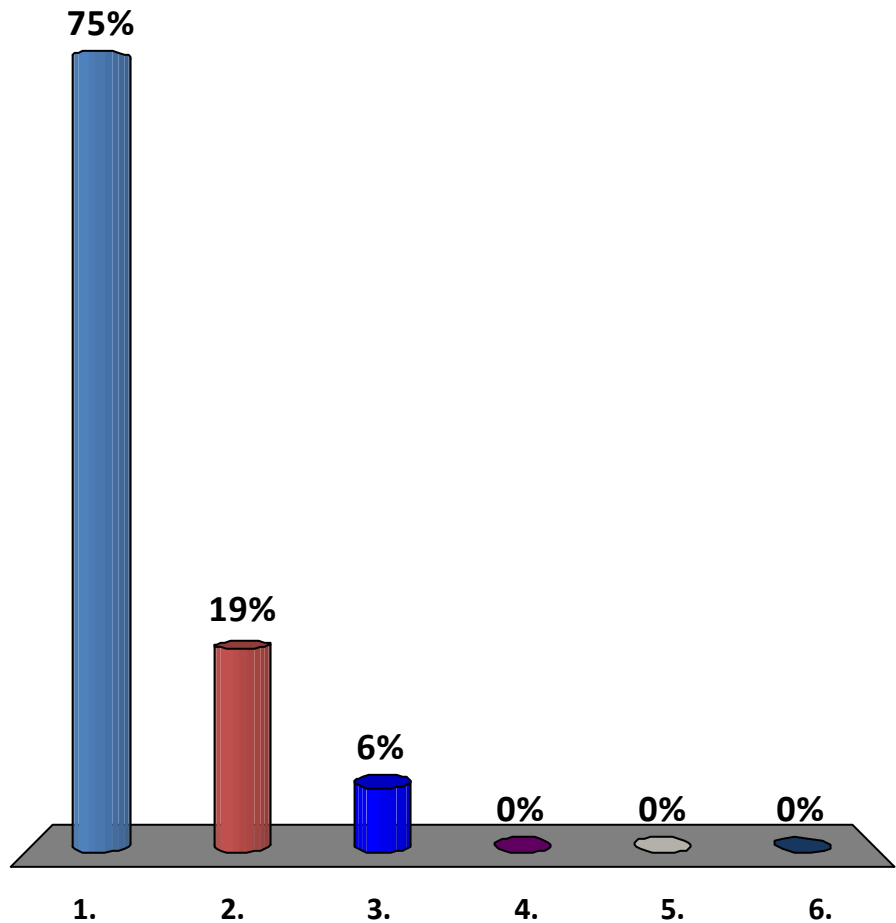
